As the old saying goes, "This town wasn't built on winners", and that is something problem gamblers forget more often than those who gamble socially. Social gambling can be a fun activity, with no negative impacts for most individuals. However, for those that suffer from a gambling addiction, the financial impacts faced can be devastating, often occurring in a very short time period and taking years to recover from. These negative financial effects are not only felt by the gambler, but also their family, friends, employers, and other members of the community as well.

According to *Time Magazine*, the total debt for Americans in 2016 was **\$935.6 billion**. Additionally, the average American between the ages of 18 and 65 has \$4,717 in credit card debt.

The month of April is Financial Literacy month in the United States and is dedicated to teaching Americans how to establish and maintain healthy financial habits. According to data collected by the Florida Council on Compulsive Gambling's (FCCG) 888 ADMIT-IT helpline, in 2015-2016, the average amount of lifetime gambling losses per individual was \$168,052, and the average gambling debt was \$49,281, with more than half of this debt being owed to credit cards.
